MEMBERS PRESENT: Chairperson Sherry Graehling, Mr. John Elterich, Ms. Lea Cline, Mr. Paul Scharnett, Ms. Ann Bailen, and Ms. Georgene Chissell

MEMBERS ABSENT: Mr. Levi Sturgeon

OTHERS PRESENT: Mr. Bob Mahrt, Community Development Director

CALL TO ORDER: Chairperson Graehling called the meeting to order at 5:00 P. M.

ROLL CALL: Ms. Mahrt called the roll. Six members were present and quorum was established.

PUBLIC COMMENT: None

MINUTES:

The Commission reviewed the minutes of the March 21, 2019 meeting. There was general discussion on presenting scrivener errors directly to staff for revision, if they did not represent a substantial departure from the Commission's deliberations. Ms. Cline motioned to approve the minutes as corrected. Seconded by Mr. Scharnett. The motion was approved by voice vote.

REGULAR AGENDA:

OTHER BUSINESS:

A. Heritage Award Nomination Review

The Commission agreed to review and vote individually on the Heritage Award nominations based on the separate nomination categories. There was general discussion on considering prior years nominations for 2019 and discussion on reasons for redacting the names of the nominator.

The nomination for the Individual Committed to Preservation category was Greg Koos, former Executive Director of the McLean County Museum of History. There was consensus on this nomination being supported. Mr. Scharnett motioned to approve the nomination. Seconded by Ms. Cline. The motion was approved 6-0 with the following votes cast on roll call: Ms. Cline—

yes; Mr. Scharnett—yes; Mr. Elterich—yes; Ms. Chissell—yes; Ms. Ann Bailen —yes; Chairperson Graehling—yes.

The nomination for the Restoration category was Mike Manna for 417 North Main Street. There was discussion on the prior practice to not provide more than one award to a nominee. Mr. Manna had been nominated for both Restoration and Adaptive Re-Use. Ms. Cline motioned to approve the nomination for the Restoration award. Seconded by Ms. Chissell. The motion was approved 6-0 with the following votes cast on roll call: Ms. Cline—yes; Mr. Scharnett—yes; Mr. Elterich—yes; Ms. Chissell—yes; Ms. Ann Bailen —yes; Chairperson Graehling—yes.

The nomination for the Rehabilitation category was Inn Front, LLC for 236 East Front Street. There was discussion on the quality of the rehabilitation that did not appear to fully meet preservation standards. The Commission reviewed the intent of the nomination category to determine appropriateness of the award and to evaluate the intended differences between a rehabilitation versus restoration project. Ms. Cline motioned to approve the nomination. Seconded by Mr. Elterich. The motion was approved 5-1 with the following votes cast on roll call: Ms. Cline—yes; Mr. Scharnett—no; Mr. Elterich—yes; Ms. Chissell—yes; Ms. Ann Bailen —yes; Chairperson Graehling—yes.

The nomination for the Adaptive Re-use category was Mike Manna for 417 North Main Street. There was continued discussion on the prior practice to not provide more than one award to a nominee. There was general consensus to not award for Adaptive Re-Use in 2019. Mr. Scharnett motioned to deny the nomination. Seconded by Ms. Bailen. The motion to deny the nomination was approved 5-1 with the following votes cast on roll call: Ms. Cline—yes; Mr. Scharnett—yes; Mr. Elterich—Abstain; Ms. Chissell—yes; Ms. Ann Bailen —yes; Chairperson Graehling—yes.

The nomination for the Landscape Restoration category was the City of Bloomington Township – Evergreen Cemetery and Funk’s Grove Cemetery Association – 7218 North 400 East Road, McLean, Illinois. There was discussion on the past practice to not support nominations outside of the Commission’s jurisdiction in relation to the Funk’s Grove Cemetery Association nomination. The Commission further discussed the potential for reaching out to either the McLean County Board and/or the McLean County Museum of History to accept nominations outside the City limits.

The Commission continued discussion on the merits of the Landscape Restoration nomination for the City of Bloomington Township – Evergreen Cemetery. It was identified that Evergreen Cemetery had experienced neglect over time, which was addressed during the recent landscape restoration. Mr. Scharnett motioned to approve the nomination for Evergreen Cemetery. Seconded by Ms. Bailen.. The motion was approved 6-0 with the following votes cast on roll call: Ms. Cline—yes; Mr. Scharnett—yes; Mr. Elterich—yes; Ms. Chissell—yes; Ms. Ann Bailen —yes; Chairperson Graehling—yes.

The nomination for the Legacy/Multigenerational category was Funk’s Grove Cemetery Association – 7218 North 400 East Road, McLean, Illinois. There was continued discussion on the past practice to not support nominations outside of the Commission’s jurisdiction. The

Commission also discussed the need to promote the Legacy/Multigenerational category to encourage nominations in the future. Mr. Scharnett motioned to deny the nomination. Seconded by Ms. Bailen. The motion to deny the nomination was approved 6-0. with the following votes cast on roll call: Ms. Cline—yes; Mr. Scharnett—yes; Mr. Elterich—Abstain; Ms. Chissell—yes; Ms. Ann Bailen —yes; Chairperson Graehling—yes.

B. National Historic Preservation Month

1. Farmers' Market – May 11, 2019

Director Mahrt indicated that there would be an outreach effort during the May 11, 2019 Farmer's Market. Commissioner's were requested to contact City Planner Simpson to participate.

2. City Council – Proclamation – May 13, 2019

The National Historic Preservation Month Proclamation will be made during the May 13, 2019 City Council meeting. Chairperson Graehling was requested to attend the meeting to accept the proclamation.

3. Heritage Awards Ceremony – May 14, 2019 McLean County Museum of History.

Director Mahrt stated that the Heritage Awards Ceremony was scheduled for May 14, 2019. There was general discussion on coordination with the McLean County Museum of History and the Town of Normal to make the ceremony more of a celebration than as a meeting.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mr. Elterich indicated that the property at 809 North McLean had recently sold.

ADJOURNMENT:

Mr. Elterich motioned to adjourn. Seconded by Mr. Scharnett. The meeting was adjourned at 6:05 P.M. by voice vote.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

401 W. Graham Street is located on the northwest corner of W. Graham Street and N. Roosevelt Ave. The brick home is built in a Greek revival style. A Gothic revival wrap around wooden porch spans the entire front façade on N. Roosevelt Avenue and W. Graham Street. 401 W. Graham Street was constructed in 1854. The property has the S-4, Local Historic District Zoning Overlay designation, and was home to Horatio G. Bent former Bloomington School Board President. Bent Elementary school, located in the neighborhood, is named after Horatio G. Bent.



The proposed project involves masonry work on fourteen (14) 16' X 16' pillars, repairs to the brick walls, and repairs to the brick basement stairwell. All elements of the project are visible to the street. The brick columns supporting the porch are in a dire state and badly in need of repair. The pillars are deteriorating and some have already been

replaced with concrete blocks. The settling of the porch is causing strain on the roof and the decorative wooden columns have begun to bow. The home is also experiencing minor cracking due in the walls and foundations due to settling, as well as the age of the structure. The applicant proposes to dig the porch column foundations to the frost depth. The foundation would be rebuilt with concrete blocks and then the pillar would be reconstructed, up to 2 ft above grade, with salvageable bricks, or matching bricks. As per the Architectural Review Guidelines, the mason should use cement-lime mortar mix and attempt to match the existing bricks in color, texture, and size.



The property is a multifamily, non-owner occupied property. Prevailing wage is required for this project. The quote specifies that time will be billed at \$55.00/hr. This figure exceeds prevailing wage for a Mason in McLean County. The applicant is requesting \$5,000.00 funding; the total project is \$10,250.00. The project is necessary and the improvements should help prevent future damage to the home and the porch. All tuck-pointing should be completed in accordance with National Park Service Preservation Brief Number 2 and Illinois Preservation Brief Number 10.

Analysis

Action by the Historic Preservation Commission: The City of Bloomington Historic Preservation Commission shall make a determination regarding the appropriateness of the proposed work based on the architectural review guidelines and Rehabilitation Standards from the Secretary of the Interior

FINDINGS OF FACT:

For each Certificate of Appropriateness and/or Grant awarded the Historic Preservation Commission shall be guided by the following general standards in addition to any design guidelines in the ordinance designating the landmark or historic district:

- 1. Every reasonable effort shall be made to provide a compatible use for a property that requires minimal alteration of the building, structure, or site and its environment, or to use a property for its originally intended purpose; **The standard is met.***
- 2. The distinguishing original qualities or character of a building, structure, or site and its environment shall not be destroyed. The removal or alteration of any historic material or distinctive architectural feature should be avoided when possible; the applicant should try to salvage as many of the existing bricks as possible. New bricks should match in size, color and texture. The mason should use a cement-lime mortar mix that also matches in color and texture. The applicant should avoid power washing or abrasive cleaning methods. Tuck-pointing should be completed in accordance with National Park Service Brief #2 and Illinois Preservation Brief #10 **The standard is met.***

3. *All buildings, structures, and sites shall be recognized as products of their own times. Alterations that have no historical basis and that seek to create an earlier appearance shall be discouraged;* The applicant proposes reusing existing bricks, when able, and matching the existing brick with new brick when necessary. ***The standard is met.***
4. *Changes that may have taken place in the course of time are evidence of the history and development of a building, structure or site and its environment. These changes may have acquired significance in their own right, and this significance shall be recognized and respected;* ***the standard is met.***
5. *Distinctive stylistic features or examples of skilled craftsmanship that characterize a building, structure, or site shall be treated with sensitivity;* repairing the porch foundations will help protect the decorative porch columns. ***The standard is met.***
6. *Deteriorated architectural features shall be repaired rather than replaced, wherever possible. In the event replacement is necessary, the new material should match the material being replaced in composition, design, color, texture and other visual qualities. Repair or replacement of missing architectural features should be based on accurate duplication of features, substantiated by historic, physical or pictorial evidence, rather than on conjectural designs or the availability of different architectural elements from other buildings or structures;* The applicant acknowledges the standard in the scope of work. ***The standard is met.***
7. *The surface cleaning of structures shall be undertaken with the gentlest means possible. Sandblasting and other cleaning methods that will damage the historic building materials shall not be undertaken;* the applicant should avoid power washing or abrasive cleaning methods like sandblasting. The Commission may add a condition to the Certificate of Appropriateness, if necessary. ***The standard is met.***
8. *Every reasonable effort shall be made to protect and preserve archeological resources affected by, or adjacent to, any project;* ***the standard is not applicable.***
9. *Contemporary design for alteration and additions to existing properties shall not be discouraged when such alterations and additions do not destroy significant historical, architectural, or cultural material, and such design is compatible with the size, scale, color, material and character of the property, neighborhood, or environment. (Ordinance No. 2006-137, Section 44.11-5D)* ***The standard is met.***

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: *Staff recommends the Historic Preservation Commission approve case BHP-07-19 and case BHP-08-19 for Certificate of Appropriateness and Funk Grant of \$5000.00 for restoration work on the porch pillars at 401 W. Graham St.*

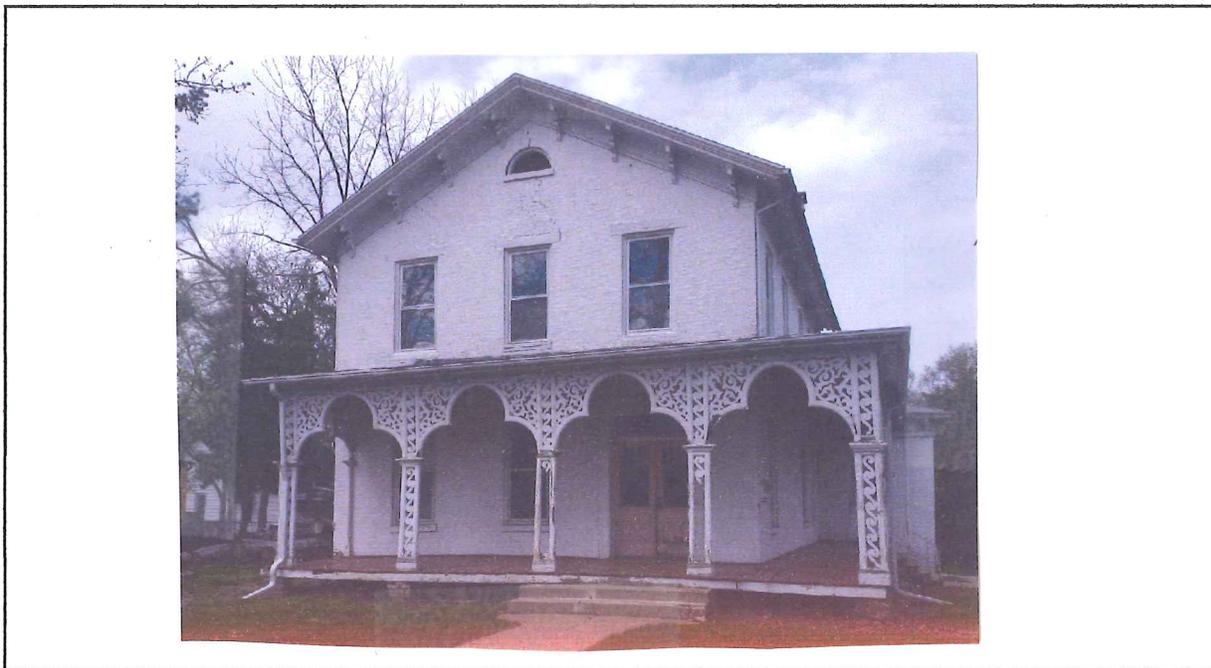

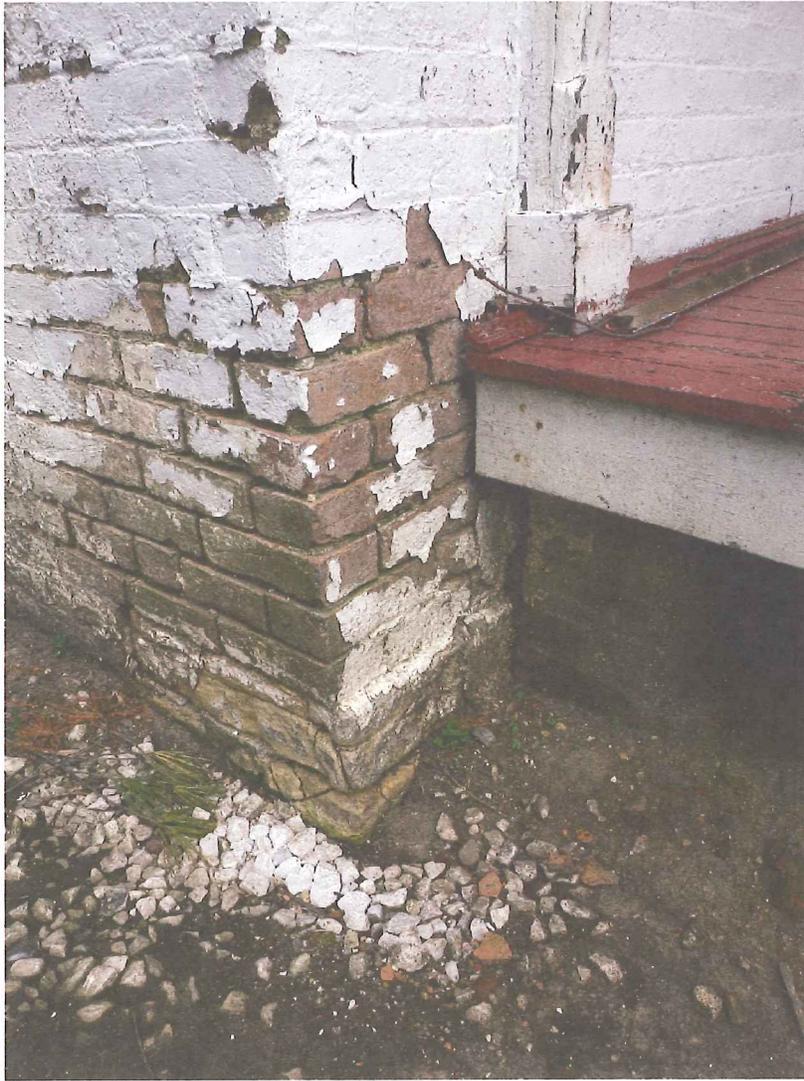






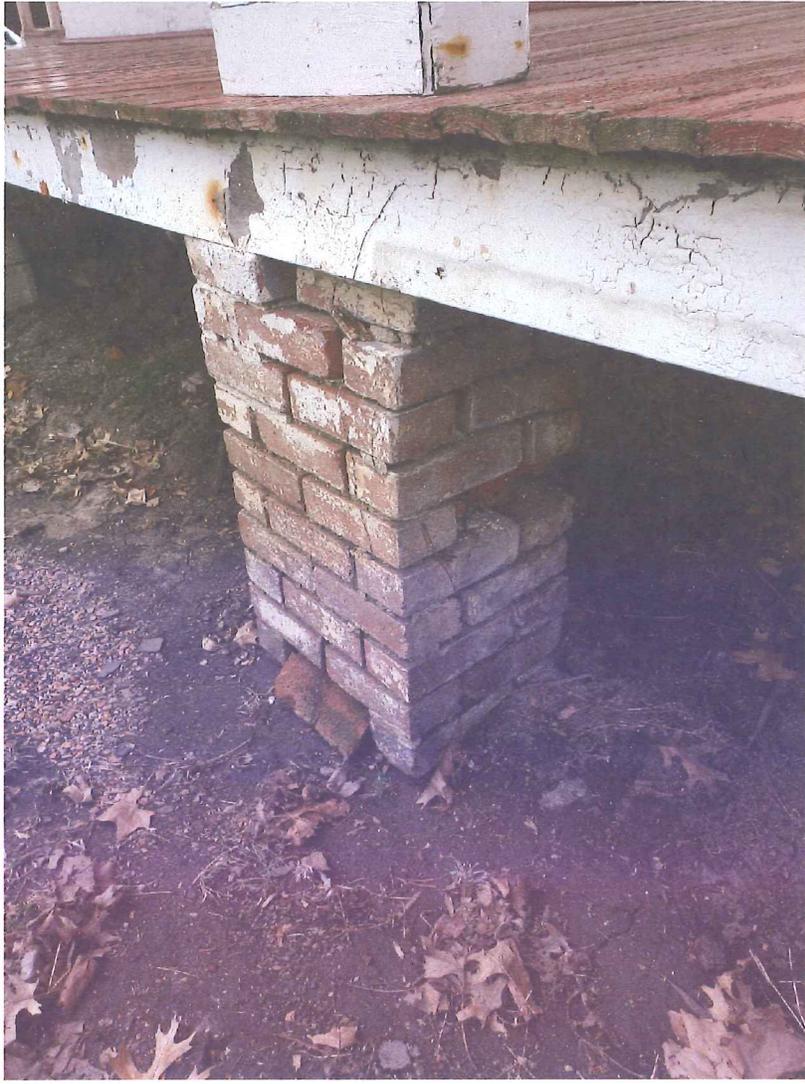

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

1005 E. Jefferson St. is located in the Davis-Jefferson Historic District. The property is also listed on the National Register of Historic Places. 1005 E. Jefferson is constructed in the Georgian revival style. A large front porch spans the front and west side of the home. The porch has a flat roof, which the applicant would like to replace. The applicant is requesting a Certificate of Appropriateness and Funk Grant in the amount of \$1500.00. The proposed scope of work involves removing the existing roof system and replacing it with 1inch ISO board tapered to ½ inch. A TPO (thermoplastic olefin) completely adhesive adhered low slope roof system will be added to the front porch deck. A custom made drip edge is proposed for the outside perimeter of the porch. Cover tape will be installed on the outside perimeter of the roof and over the drip edge. The proposal also includes removing siding and running the TPO approximately 1ft up the wall and flashing properly. A water cut will be applied where needed. The total cost of the project is \$4910.78.

According to www.tporoofing.com, "TPO is a single ply roofing system consisting of a thermoplastic polyolefin membrane. The membrane contains three layers: 1). TPO polymer base; 2). Polyester-reinforced fabric center (scrim); 3). Thermoplastic polyolefin compounded top ply." The system is available in three colors: white; light gray; and black. The roof system is not visible from the street. Although the original roof system being removed is metal, the

Bloomington Architectural Review Guidelines allow flat roofs which are not visible from the street to be replaced with any new material (M.4f). Additionally, the cover tape should match the white fascia, gutters and soffit systems in case it is visible. The applicant should use care when removing any wood siding. If possible, the applicant should try to minimize the visibility of the flashing and/or TPO systems.



Analysis

Action by the Historic Preservation Commission: The City of Bloomington Historic Preservation Commission shall make a determination regarding the appropriateness of the proposed work based on the architectural review guidelines and Rehabilitation Standards from the Secretary of the Interior

FINDINGS OF FACT:

For each Certificate of Appropriateness and/or Grant awarded the Historic Preservation Commission shall be guided by the following general standards in addition to any design guidelines in the ordinance designating the landmark or historic district:

1. *Every reasonable effort shall be made to provide a compatible use for a property that requires minimal alteration of the building, structure, or site and its environment, or to use a property for its originally intended purpose; **the standard is met.***
2. *The distinguishing original qualities or character of a building, structure, or site and its environment shall not be destroyed. The removal or alteration of any historic material or distinctive architectural feature should be avoided when possible; The applicant should use care when removing wooden siding and applying the TPO system. Although the existing roof is more historically appropriate, the Bloomington Architectural Review guidelines allow alternative materials on roofs not visible from the street. **The standard is met.***
3. *All buildings, structures, and sites shall be recognized as products of their own times. Alterations that have no historical basis and that seek to create an earlier appearance shall be discouraged; flat metal roofs were more common after WWI; nonetheless, the roof is not visible from the street. **The standard is met.***
4. *Changes that may have taken place in the course of time are evidence of the history and development of a building, structure or site and its environment. These changes may have acquired significance in their own right, and this significance shall be recognized and respected; the applicant should use care to ensure no significant and damaging changes occur on the addition or the structure when removing siding or applying the TPO system. **The standard is met.***

5. *Distinctive stylistic features or examples of skilled craftsmanship that characterize a building, structure, or site shall be treated with sensitivity; **the standard is met.***
6. *Deteriorated architectural features shall be repaired rather than replaced, wherever possible. In the event replacement is necessary, the new material should match the material being replaced in composition, design, color, texture and other visual qualities. Repair or replacement of missing architectural features should be based on accurate duplication of features, substantiated by historic, physical or pictorial evidence, rather than on conjectural designs or the availability of different architectural elements from other buildings or structures; **the standard is met.***
7. *The surface cleaning of structures shall be undertaken with the gentlest means possible. Sandblasting and other cleaning methods that will damage the historic building materials shall not be undertaken; **the standard is met.***
8. *Every reasonable effort shall be made to protect and preserve archeological resources affected by, or adjacent to, any project; **the standard is met.***
9. *Contemporary design for alteration and additions to existing properties shall not be discouraged when such alterations and additions do not destroy significant historical, architectural, or cultural material, and such design is compatible with the size, scale, color, material and character of the property, neighborhood, or environment. (Ordinance No. 2006-137, Section 44.11-5D) **The standard is met.***

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: *Staff recommends the Historic Preservation Commission approve case BHP-09-19 and case BHP-10-19 for a COA and Funk Grant for \$1,500.00 to replace the porch roof at 1005 E. Jefferson St.*

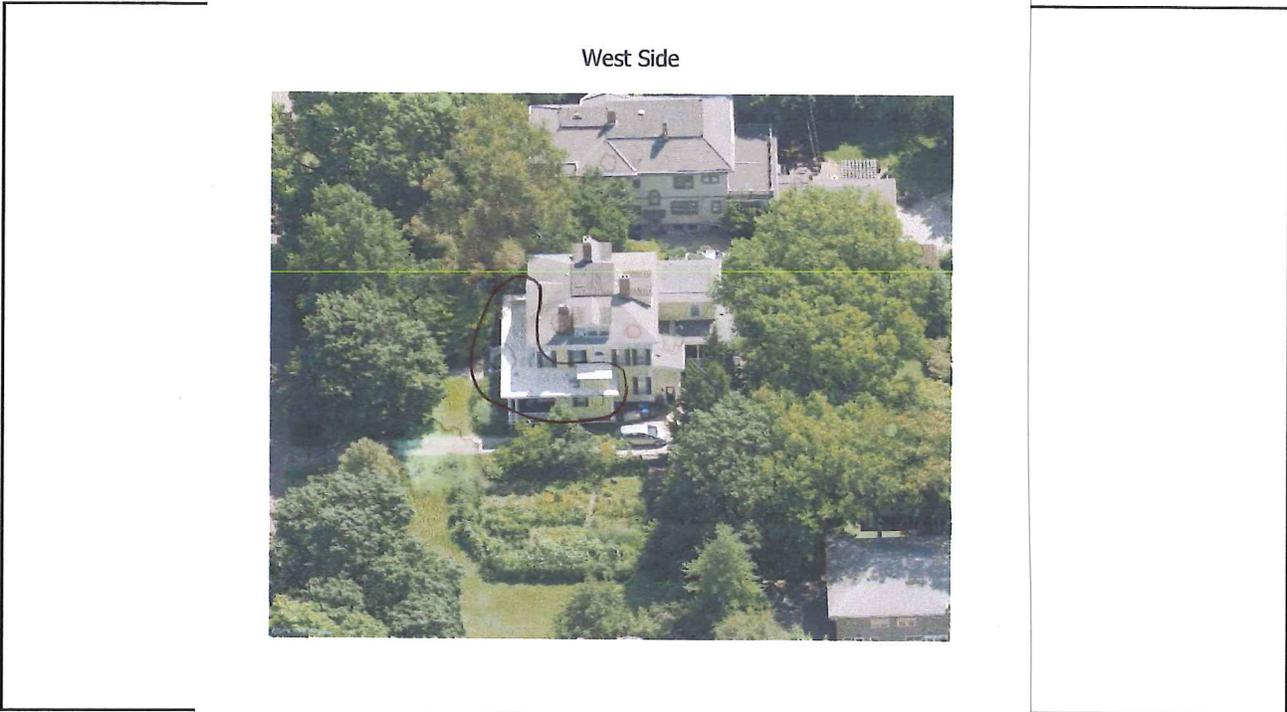

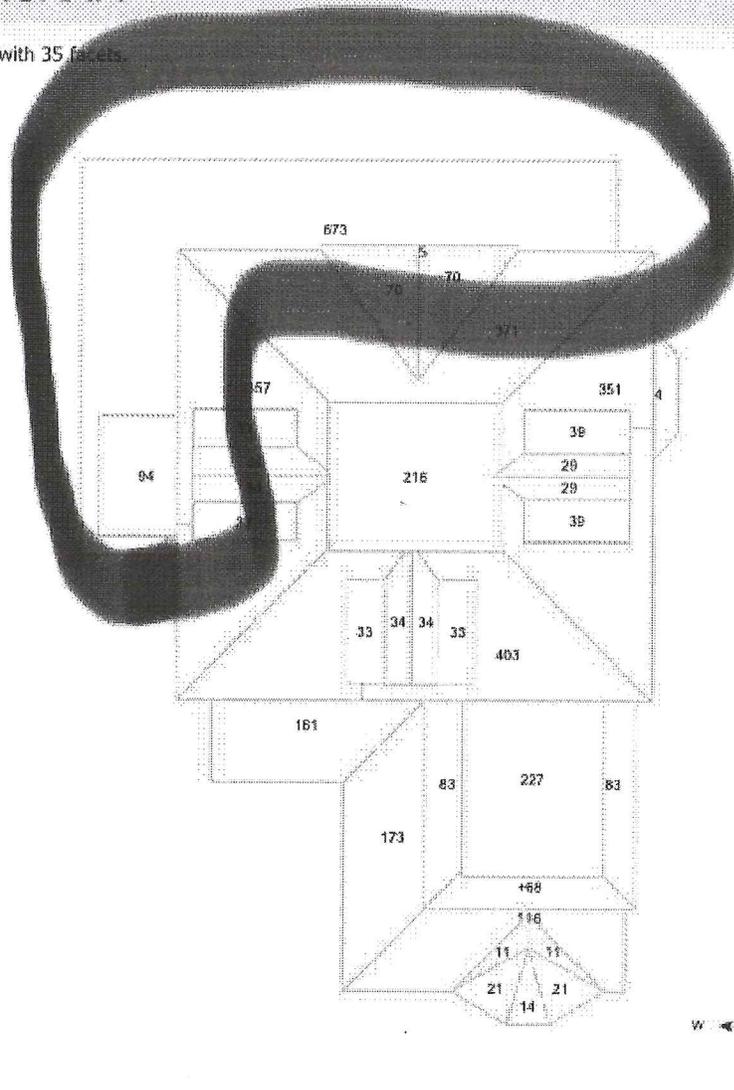
